## **PUBLIC HEALTH (MPH) MASTER OF PUBLIC HEALTH**

All Salus students are educated in an interdisciplinary environment that prepares our graduates to become contributing members of today's healthcare teams and the MPH program is no exception. With a dedicated and diverse faculty each bringing a set of unique experiences and perspectives to their students, our MPH curriculum is firmly rooted in real world situations.

The MPH program is 42 semester credit units in length and is offered via distance education on a part-time basis. Students will have up to five (5) years to complete the program. Also offered are Public Health Certificate Programs in Health Policy and Humanitarian Healthcare that are 15 semester credit units in length. All courses are taught completely online.

Applications are accepted on a continuous basis throughout the year. Once accepted, students can begin to register for courses in the term immediately following matriculation, depending on the individual's course of studies.

### **FINANCIAL INFORMATION**

**Tuition & Fees:** Public Health degree and certificate programs: \$753/credit. Tuition and fees are due and payable at the start of each semester and are subject to change.

**Financial Aid:** Applicants are encouraged to seek employer support for public health courses in degree and non-degree tracks. In particular, government employees should seek advice from their agency about that agency's policy on tuition remission. The MPH program is approved for individuals who are eligible to receive tuition benefits under the Montgomery/Post 9-11 GI

## PREREQUISITES

This program seeks individuals who have the educational prerequisites, interest and motivation for undertaking and advancing in public health careers, consistent with the program's stated mission, goals and objectives. Admission procedures and policies will appropriately weigh the individual's public health experience and/or the candidate's ability to apply educational preparation from such diverse fields as economic development, urban planning, sociology, informatics, etc. In addition, it is expected that the successful candidate for the degree (MPH) or certificate programs will possess:

- Relevant undergraduate degree or its equivalent
- Documented record of academic achievement
- Demonstrated academic competency in mathematics or quantitative methods
- English language skills essential to the successful completion of the coursework

Additional requirements for admission into the program include the following:

- Educational Resume/Curriculum Vita
- Life Experience Essay (250-500 words)
- Personal Statement Essay (250-500 words)
- Two Personal References
- Official transcripts of all college course work completed
