### **Salus University to Host ARTsisters Exhibition**

**Elkins Park, PA** – Salus University will host ARTsisters “VISIONARY” Exhibition at the Hafter Student Center on campus from October 4 through November 9. The exhibition will kick off on Thursday, October 6 at 4:30 p.m. with a lecture, titled “Vision and Perception in Art” given by ARTsister Elynne Rosenfield and Dr. Lynne Greenspan, assistant professor at Salus University. An opening reception will also be held on Sunday, October 9 from 1-3 p.m. Both events will be held at the Hafter Student Center located at 50 Breyer Drive, Elkins Park, Pennsylvania.

The show, named “VISIONARY” mixes art with imagery focused on the sense of sight. ARTsisters will donate 20 percent of sales from the month long exhibition to the University’s tenth annual “Looking Out for Kids” charity fundraiser, which is scheduled for Saturday, October 29. ARTsisters has also donated original drawings, paintings and monotypes for the silent auction at the fundraiser. “Looking Out for Kids” provides comprehensive vision exams and eyeglasses to uninsured and underinsured children in the Philadelphia area.
