New State Historical Marker Unveiled to Celebrate Philadelphia's McAllister Family

PHILADELPHIA – On Sunday, August 21st, the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission, in partnership with the McAllister Committee, will unveil a new state historical marker at 200 Chestnut Street to celebrate the legacy of Philadelphia's McAllister family. The new historical marker will highlight the contributions of the McAllister family to optometry and the ophthalmology profession across Pennsylvania and beyond.

John McAllister Sr. was an optician in Philadelphia in the early 19th century who was famous for selling custom eyeglasses to individuals, including Thomas Jefferson, at his optical shop, formerly located at 200 Chestnut Street. For four generations, the McAllister family worked to advance optometry and ophthalmology (surgical eye care) in Philadelphia, with connections to Wills Eye Hospital, the Pennsylvania College of Optometry (now known as Salus University), and the American Optometric Association.

Ahead of the unveiling, the McAllister Committee will host a lecture highlighting the history of the McAllister family at Wills Eye Hospital.
