- Complete a bachelor's degree (minimum overall GPA of 3.0 recommended)
- Complete the prerequisite coursework with a grade of 'C' or higher
- Submit letters of recommendation
- Shadow a licensed occupational therapist(s) for a minimum of 8 hours (30 hours of observation in both pediatric and adult settings is highly recommended)
- Submit GRE exam scores (optional)
