Vision Rehabilitation Therapy

The Department of Blindness and Low Vision Studies offers a Master of Science (MS) degree and a Certificate in Vision Rehabilitation Therapy (VRT).

Why Drexel?

- Both programs prepare professionals with the knowledge, skills, and tools to provide comprehensive instruction and training in activities of daily living to facilitate safe and independent living to/for individuals who are blind or visually impaired.
- Students gain expertise in related fields such as occupational therapy, psychology, social work, gerontology, special education in visual impairment and orientation and mobility.
- VRT programs at Drexel University, Elkins Park Campus, satisfy the requirements for national certification by the Academy for Certification of Vision Rehabilitation and Education Professionals (ACVREP).
- Programs can be taken on a full-time or part-time basis and are mostly delivered online, with an eight to ten week summer on-campus residency, and an internship.
